Section three: Creative Project

For this project you will be creating a bug motel. This is a manmade structure that can provide shelter for insects. They can come in a variety of shapes and sizes. Many are used as nesting sites for solitary bees. These are bees that do not live in a hive with a queen and they make up a lot of our native bee species. There are a number of reasons why bees and other pollinators are so important to our landscape and crops but unfortunately 1/3 of our bee species are under threat.

Some can be made with natural materials you would find in your garden or on a walk, some can be made with recyclables and some are for the more DIY able.
