We are delighted to have everyone back at school for our final term. Staff / children have started very positively and we are all appreciating being together in the school environment. This morning it was lovely to have all our classes together via zoom for our assembly where we introduced the children to our value for April 'Readiness' and embracing the new learning opportunities. We also introduced Earth Day which will be celebrated on Thursday April 22nd. As we emerge from the pandemic, there is concern globally about the expected rise in levels of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere as life returns to some kind of normality. Standardised Tests

The DES has advised that standardised tests in literacy and and numeracy should be administered to children in classes 1st to 6th this school term. Due to the school closures last year tests were not administered in the last school year. Standardised tests, while important are just one form of assessment used by schools to assess children's progress and to inform future planning for teaching / learning. We will provide additional information on the testing process closer to the time.

Teacher / Parent Phone Calls

This term, you will receive your child's end of year school report by email on June 18th which will include the standardised test results and also provide you with updated information on your child's progress across the curriculum as well his / her social / personal development, since our first school report in December. There will be an opportunity for Parents to communicate with class teachers in the final week of term, should you need clarity on any aspect of your child's school report.
