Dear Parents/Guardians,

Welcome to our school newsletter! We hope you all enjoyed the midterm break . Staff/children have made a very positive start to the second half of term and are looking forward to busy weeks ahead . This morning our classes met on zoom for assembly where we shared news and introduced our value of Creativity . We are encouraging the children to explore new ways of being creative at home over the month of November and develop new hobbies/skills over the winter evenings . Your support with this will be greatly appreciated and I think with a little encouragement , we will all be amazed at how creative every child can be .

Our Parent/ Teacher meetings will take place on week commencing Monday November 22nd. This year, we are once again unable to carry out the Parent-Teacher meetings in the traditional face to face manner. The parent teacher meetings will take place online using the Zoom meeting software. We will be using the Connect app on Aladdin to schedule the appointments for Parents to meet with teachers. We will be setting up meetings next week and will update you as we progress plans.

Our Student Council has always played an important part in school life and given further expression to student voices. We are re-forming our Student Council and elections will be help at class level 1st to 6th this month. Due to covid restrictions, it will not be possible to have our Junior and Senior Infant children join meetings for the time being but we will ensure that their ideas are incorporated into our meetings. Ian and Amanda will be working with our Student Council and we look forward to introducing our new council to you shortly.

We are beginning our anti-bullying lessons in all classes this week. Our particular focus will be on lessons in Walk Tall, RSE and Stay Safe where children are taught explicitly to identify the different types of bullying, prevention and reporting of any incidents of a bullying nature. Children starting at 8.50 a.m should be at the school gate at 8.45 a.m. Children starting at 9.00 a.m. should be at the gates at 8.55 a.m. Children who are more than 10 minutes late should come to reception to be signed in at arrival. Thank you to Leisel and Tonia who are very kindly giving of their time every morning to help with traffic flow . This is making a difference and we thank you for your co-operation in helping to make the journey to school safer for every child . We ask that you make sure not to park close to the turning point at the top of the driveway as this is inhibiting drivers from turning around to come back down . We also ask that you do not reverse or do a u turn on the driveway . This is extremely dangerous as it is very often not possible to see young children who may be crossing at junction to adjoining apartments .
