Covid-19:

As we move on in the pandemic and many aspects of society return to some normality, I would like to thank you and Staff /children for your continued support and co-operation with procedures in place .Unfortunately, despite all the efforts being made by Parents/ Staff and Students, the incidence rate in the school was at its highest so far in January. It is, as always, a reminder that we still must take care and follow the simple guidelines of social distancing, hand washing and mask wearing. Children in classes 3rd-6th deserve great credit for the efforts they are making with wearing of masks. All procedures including the wearing of masks for children in senior classes, remains unchanged, until such time as we receive updated guidance from the Department of Education.

We would appreciate if you could continue to advise the school if there is a positive case in your household. Children who are ill need time to rest and recover fully before returning to school work. Teachers are putting the weekly homework and spelling lists up on Seesaw for access for children who are out of school isolating but not necessarily unwell. We have also added an additional padlet of activities to the Emergency Home learning section of the website which may also be helpful for your child.

Traffic Management:

We have noticed a huge improvement in the traffic flow / behaviour outside the school each morning and would like to thank all those volunteers for their continued support. We urgently need a few more volunteers, so if you can help even on one day per week, please speak to one of the volunteers or contact the school office.

A reminder that if your child arrives to school after 9.10am, they should use the main door at Reception. If you are collecting your child early please come to Reception and Veronica / Barbara will sign them out. If your child is absent from school, please either complete an absence form on the school website or email the school at info@letns.org. In the event that your child is not going to be collected on time, please contact the office to let them know.
