### Parent -Teacher meetings

We are delighted to welcome you back to the school this year for our Parent/ Teacher meetings which will take place on week commencing November 21<sup>st</sup>.

Most meetings will take place on Tuesday 22nd and Wednesday 23rd, but there are other options available for some class teachers. In order to allocate Parent/ Teacher meetings slots that are convenient for you, we will be using the Connect App on Aladdin, which will allow you to self-schedule your meeting. ### Release of schedules will be staggered as follow,

At 3 p.m. today, Parents with three or more children will be able to schedule their meetings on the app . The app will not allow you to schedule meetings one after the other, to allow for overruns etc. There must be a 20 minute gap between each meeting

From 9.a.m. tomorrow Tuesday Parents with 2 children will be able to schedule meetings

From 12.00 tomorrow all other Parents will be able to schedule their meeting. The Special Education team will make their own arrangements to schedule meetings with Parents/Guardians where relevant.

We look forward to discussing with you, your child's progress and how we can continue to work together to ensure the best possible educational outcomes for your child. We hope that all Parents will take the opportunity to attend the Parent / Teacher meetings in person. Should you not be able to attend a meeting on the designated dates, please contact your child's teacher by email or a note in your child's journal. Class teachers will do their best to offer you an alternative time which is convenient for you. We look forward to meeting you over Parent / Teacher days.
