Last week we were delighted to welcome three inspectors from the Department of Education who were here to do a curriculum evaluation of SPHE (Social, Personal, Health Education) The team visited 60% of classrooms over the two days as well as meeting our middle management team and a cohort of children (randomly selected) from our fifth and sixth classes.

The Inspectors were very complimentary about our school and in particular about the quality of teaching and learning they observed —which was the main focus of the inspection . They were especially impressed by the general atmosphere in the school and how confident , happy and enthusiastic the children were about their learning and experience of school . The quality of the pupils learning outcomes in SPHE was very good and pupils displayed commendable levels of knowledge, dispositions and skills .

We will receive a detailed written report in November which we will share with you . We are very proud of our Staff and Children and thank them for their wonderful commitment and contribution to creating a fantastic school environment. We are also hugely appreciative of your support and input in supporting your child's education and the work of the school .Well done to all .

As you are aware, our value for October is Positivity and children have been reflecting and sharing on what brings them joy and makes them smile. This week we have been celebrating Well-Being week with the focus on helping children to focus on an aspect of wellbeing each day. The week began with Mindful Movement Monday, with a focus on the importance of keeping active and how exercise improves our sense of Well being.
