BOM Agreed Report



The Board of Management met in school on Tuesday the 23rd January 2024. Below is their Agreed Report:

•The Board discussed concerns from local residents and parents regarding parking and safety on the road outside the school. South Dublin County Council have responded to concerns raised and communicated that the appropriate road markings are in place outside the school and violations should be referred to An Garda Siochana for enforcement. The Board agreed that we must raise awareness of road safety and encourage the children to have a role in highlighting the issue.

•The Board discussed admissions opening on the 29th January 2024 for Outreach classes.

The Board have accepted the advice from the school accountant and will prioritise securing and improving the school's finances to ensure the ongoing solvency of the school following consecutive deficits (2022 - €99,805 / 2023 - €90,592).
The Board thanks the staff team for their extraordinary effort this school year. The Board is very aware of the challenges they are facing and we very much appreciate the work they are doing for the students in the school.

•The Board acknowledges the work undertaken in developing the Whole School Learn Together Plan, the Board would like to thank all staff for their contribution and particularly thank Amanda for leading the process.

•The Board would like to thank Derek Mannion for his excellent service to the Executive as Chairperson and would also like to wish Claire Hayes the very best as she assumes the role.

• The Board ratified the Protected Disclosure Policy which is available to view on the school website.

•The Board reviewed the Policy Review Calendar and have identified outstanding policies.

•The Board is pleased to learn that Therese Hesse along with the Student Council will research barriers to attendance and identify strategies for promoting greater levels of attendance across the school.

•The Board would like to thank Muireann for supporting staff as they transition over to Microsoft Teams.

•The Board would also like to thank the Wellbeing Committee for conducting a survey among all stakeholders and for developing an action plan to promote wellbeing across the school community, as well as, all their efforts in organising activities to take place across Wellbeing Week.

•The Board is looking forward welcoming an Irish Music Workshop during Seachtain na Gaeilge, as well as, Food Dudes returning to promote healthy eating.

•The Board would like to thank Catriona for facilitating staff training with Fiona Forman, author of Weaving Wellbeing, as well as, securing sustained support from the PDST in the area of Wellbeing.

•The Board is looking forward to Valerie returning to support Sixth Class Art projects in advance of their transition to Secondary.

•The Board is also looking forward to the PTA fundraising event later in the year and would like to thank all involved in organising the event.

·Ian Scott was confirmed as the Ethos Representative, while Kirk Delaney will assume the oversight of School/Hall Rental on the Board.

•The Board would like to develop a plan/vision related to the vacant plot of land adjacent to the school. The opportunity of opening additional classes for children with additional needs alongside the potential for developing part of the site for a safe set down and drop off zone for the school is something we would like to work towards. The establishment of a working group may help the creation, delivery and promotion of such a proposal.

•The Board agreed dates for futures meetings: 13th February 2024, 20th March 2024, 24th April 2024 & 22nd May 2024. •Finally, the Board would like to offer its sincere condolences to the Meehan/Donegan families following their recent loss.
