Sarah's 6th Class - Japan by Emilia



We have crafts of the iconic red Shinto gates, the erupted volcano of Mount Asos and the fabric doll of a Geisha (which was made by the writer).


Swimming - 3rd Class by Eva

About LETNS Parent Teacher Association

All parents and guardians of children attending Lucan Educate Together National School automatically become members of the PTA when their children join the school. The PTA is run entirely by volunteers, ensuring that everyone has an opportunity to get involved in ways that suit their interests and availability.

Mission Statement: to support our teachers, and families to enhance the education of all the children in Lucan Educate Together National School.

PTA Volunteers

The PTA Volunteers group forms the backbone of our association. Without our dedicated volunteers, all of our fun events like the Halloween party, Walk in the Park, and bake sales would not be possible. Joining the Volunteers group does not mean you have to help at every event—just as much as you can.

We encourage all parents to sign up for the Volunteers group for at least one year during their child's time at LETNS, and we ask each volunteer to assist with at least one event per year.

Time required: Flexible and based on your availability.

PTA Class Rep

Our class reps are an essential part of the PTA as they make sure all of the classes are aware of any updates from the PTA Committee and equally they make the committee aware of any issues in the classrooms. Without the connection to each class, the PTA committee would be able to work effectively.

Time required: 10-15 mins a week

We ask that class reps attend the PTA meetings if possible to bring up any issues from their class and to have a good awareness of the work underway in the PTA.

PTA Committee

The PTA committee is a small group of parents who come together to organize and oversee the work of the PTA. The committee members are all normal parents like you who balance their PTA roles with other responsibilities and jobs outside of the association.

Time required: It varies from less than 30 mins a week to a few hours when there is an event.

The PTA Committee is elected every year.

Friend of the PTA

If you don't have time to be a class rep and you are worried about committing to be a volunteer – could you be a friend of the PTA?

As a Friend of the PTA, there are many small, meaningful ways to contribute. You could volunteer to read with students in various classes (not just your child's), visit a classroom to share something interesting about yourself, or offer your unique skills or experiences to support PTA activities. Even simple acts, like tidying up the lost and found area when it's messy, or picking up litter around the school grounds during drop-off or pick-up, make a big difference.
