- The Board confirmed ½ in, ½ out staff meeting on the 2lst January 2026. School will close at 13:30 on this
 date to facilitate 2-hour staff training.
- The Board would like to thank all staff for their contribution to an ANA allocation review, particular thanks to Therese Hesse for overseeing the application.
- The Board would like to thank the PTA for all their support this Term. Supporting the Dyslexia Awareness Bake Sale, managing the Halloween Disco, assisting with Lost & Found organisation, for all the volunteers who assist with reading, school trips and swimming. The support is greatly appreciated and invaluable.
- The Board would also like to thank the PTA for organising a very well attended Parent Talk delivered by Connected Childhood. The feedback has been very positive and we would like to support future talks of this nature for our school community.
- The Board were pleased to learn that more staff will be trained as First Aid Responders in the coming weeks.
- The Board would like to offer their sincere condolences to Maria Commons, following the recent loss of her father.
- Finally, the Board would like to congratulate the Eimear McDonagh & Helen Mannion on the arrival of their baby boys, we wish them all the very best at this very special time.
